## SOME SUPPOSED "CHRISTIAN" BOOKS ARE POISON AND WITCHCRAFT

Recently, I made a new friend on Facebook. This friend is not afraid, to tell the truth about the drek that is going into and coming out of churches. 

Fiction always leads us down the path where we become the book and when we identify with a book that way, we tend to advocate for it and defend it. Go into these books looking for problems, not for solutions. Pray for discernment before you read any of them. You'll notice in the lists below that strong believers in Yahweh have read these book and found all many faults with them. In addition, if you do not have a strong relationship with Yeshua then don't read these books. Remember, that Biblical Scripture was given to us so that we could Yahweh's character. If you do not know scripture and the original, then it will be easy for you to accept a counterfeit.
